

VPN Privacy and Boundaries

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Preparation / invited access

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A VPN changes where traffic travels; it does not remove account tracking or make every application private.

Before you start

Use the access and features actually assigned to your account. Keep a rollback or recovery route before changing existing service settings.

Steps

1. Understand which traffic the profile routes and which traffic may remain outside it.
2. Keep HTTPS and application authentication enabled.
3. Review the published privacy policy and avoid treating route names as guarantees of anonymity.
4. Protect endpoint devices and revoke lost profiles promptly.

Verify the result

Your expectations match the approved traffic scope and tested leak behavior. Do not send secrets to a site merely because a VPN is connected.
